Dear Friends and Shockey Cousins,

It is time to start making plans to attend the Shockey Family Reunion. This is number 40, and I have only missed one. That was last year in Oklahoma City. I was sick. The doctor said that I had all the symptoms of Lyme Disease but the tests were negative. I have had a few minor health problems since, but what can you expect when you are 91 years old?

I can't remember a Winter as bad as this one! We have missed 7 or 8 Sundays at church due to snow and we are not out of it yet. There are more pleasant places to spend the winter and I am making plans for that. I'm going south!

This year the reunion will be held in **Winchester**, **Virginia July 3rd through 7th**. I have reserved rooms at the **Holiday Inn Express** on the north side of town. If you come in on route 522, you go through 5 traffic lights and it is right there on your right. If you come in on I-81, take the route 37 bypass and you can't miss it. **The cost for rooms is \$75.00 plus tax**. Suites are more. I didn't price them. A free hot cooked breakfast is included and coffee and tea is available 24 hours a day. There is an indoor pool and exercise facility. The conference room is nice and is available Thursday through Sunday. **For reservations, call 1-540-667-7050** and specify **Shockey Reunion**. They have rooms with two queen size beds or King size. They have a limited number of handicap rooms and they used to have a few rooms that allow smoking. I didn't ask about that. Reservations must be made by June 26th and cancellations at least two weeks prior to the reunion. Make your reservations early in order to have your choice of rooms.

There are lots of places to eat nearby. The motel is located right behind Sheetz, Kentucky Fried Chicken and Arby's. Across the road are the Venice Italian Restaurant, McDonald's Starbucks and Subway. There are two large Supermarkets nearby and Wall Mart and Applebee's are about half a mile. I will provide directions to Olive Garden, TGI Friday's, Cracker Barrel, Red Lobster and Golden Corral. There is shopping near the restaurants.

The Conference room will be open on Thursday, July 3rd through Sunday. Les will be there and I plan to be there Thursday afternoon.

Friday, July 4^{th} , we will be in the Conference room all day to help with your genealogy, add information and pictures to the database and if necessary, figure out just where you fit in. If you are a Shockey or related to one, then you do fit in somewhere.

On Saturday, we offer a tour of the Shockeysville area, John Shockey's cabin in Oakland and the Oakland cemetery where many Shockeys are buried. We end the tour at Shockeysville Church about lunch time. Scott Luttrell usually brings things to make sandwiches, lemonade and iced tea and we have lunch across from the church. Scott will tell you the history of Shockeysville, many facts about the area and some amusing stories too. We don't charge for the lunch, but a donation to the church is appreciated.

On Sunday we attend services at Shockeysville Church. Services are at 10:00, so we need to leave the motel by 9:15. We all leave together so no one gets lost and we carpool too. We have lunch about 12:30 and the general meeting. I don't know which will come first. Two of my grandsons have promised to cater the lunch. They have previously done a good job. I hope to be able to do the lunch for \$10.00 each. If I can't, I may have to charge a dollar or two more. Kids under 6 eat free. Just pray it don't rain!

Those who don't do genealogy or have extra time to spend, there are things to do around Winchester. There will be brochures at the motel. Berkeley Springs, WV is only 35 miles and they have some interesting things to see. They have several antique shops and specialty shops, but I don't guarantee that they will be open. They have a real castle and there is a spa that is nor very expensive. The mineral water from the spring is 73 degrees the year round and is said to cure all sorts of things. It is said that the Indians came all the way from North Carolina to 'take the waters' for their Arthritis. George Washington came there often too. There is a 'tub' hewn out of stone that is said to be George Washington's bath tub. This is all in a nice little park right in the center of town. Washington D.C. is only a one hour drive from Winchester. There are endless things to see there. You can see all of the monuments for free and the WWII Memorial is spectacular. SHOCKEY Genealogy Updates

What is happening to time? It seems such a very short time since we were enjoying the 2013 SHOCKEY Family Reunion and now it is time to start preparing for the 2014 reunion. The 2013 reunion was strange in one way for Naomi and I. It does not seem that long ago that we were among the new ones at the reunion and this year we were the couple that had the longest unbroken string of trips to the Shockey reunion. Although we missed several of the cousins who regularly attend reunions, we met many cousins for the first time and everyone at the reunion enjoyed the visit to Oklahoma City. Those who were unable to attend sure missed some really good food and the singing next door. A few of the Shockey cousins were employees at the Best Western Saddleback Inn and helped to make the visit special.

This year we will be gathering in Winchester and Shockeysville, Virginia with Marie Shockey again hosting the event. Marie has the complete details for you to make your reservations in her article. I plan to once again lead tours on Saturday morning and Monday. Friday will include stops at the John Shockey cabin at Oakland, the Oakland cemetery where many Shockey family are buried and also where on entire row of the Shockey family were dug up and moved to an undisclosed location. Last but not least will be a stop at Shockeysville. On the Monday tour we will head north on I-81 through Maryland to Pennsylvania. Stops on Monday will include the old mill and the Shockey barn in Rouzerville, the Valentine's cave area, the overlook at PenMar Park, Harbaugh Church and Cemetery, the Harbaugh home site where Valentine's cabin was located, the Shockey Station area and the Shockey farm where eight generations of a Shockey family has lived.

The Century Aluminum Retirees continue our fight to regain our stolen health insurance benefits which we earned and were paid for with money taken from our paychecks for every hour worked. We all knew that we were exposed to many dangerous chemicals and hazards and so were willing to accept less pay in order in insure full medical coverage the remainder of our lives. As with any effort, there are only about thirty of us working to regain the benefits for over seven hundred retirees and their families. I was one of the eight chosen to be deposed by lawyers and the first of those to be questioned for slightly over three hours. We do not know how many years it will be before this comes to trial but there are plans to continue the fight as long as necessary. Many who have never been in our situation say things like "well you have Medicare so what is the problem?" The problem is that to obtain a decent supplemental policy costs over \$400.00 per month. Century Aluminum is the same company that locked us out for twenty months in the early 1990s in an effort to break our union. This resulted in many of us using up our life savings in order to survive. The NLRB ruled against the Company for the illegal Lockout and their stealing our health insurance is yet another effort on their part to get revenge. We will continue to fight.

At my age I feel that I need to slow down some but I have three more years as president of the local S.O.A.R. Chapter. This is an organization of the retiree and their family of both the Fabrication and Reduction plants at the Ravenswood Aluminum facility. I also serve as president of the Independence Cemetery Association. Of course my first priority is my church work and Bible study.

When I wrote last year's article Naomi had completed the first week of treatments and was doing remarkably well. By reunion time she had completed the two rounds of Chemo treatments which consisted of six days each and all 38 radiation treatments. Even the doctors were surprised as how well she come through the treatments. She did lose her hair but it came back thicker and curly. One funny incident happened during the Chemo treatments. The first day of the second round was a long day taking almost nine hours. Shortly after noon I needed to get something to eat. The restaurant that was within walking distance was a McDonald's. I called Naomi's cell phone to tell her. She said to bring her a Big Mac, fires and a coke. She was about half way through eating the sandwich when her Chemo Oncologist walked through.. He was three steps

past her when he turned around to take a better look. He then told her that he had never had a patient eating a Big Mac during Chemo. It was obvious that most of the other patients were not interested in eating.

Shortly after the 2013 reunion Naomi had another PET Scan. The results were great. There was no sign of any living cancer cells. The next PET Scan was scheduled for January 7th. The result of this scan was questionable and the Chemo Oncologist wanted a biopsy. The surgeon said that would be a waste of time as the radiated mass would show positive regardless. It was decided to do another scan. It was scheduled for March 10th. This scan shows five new spots. The Chemo Oncologist wanted a biopsy immediately. The surgeon had just left for a two week vacation. We finally have a biopsy scheduled for March 31st. The wait was very frustrating but the day that we finally received the results turned out to be worse. The first visit that day was to the surgeon who had taken the biopsies. He told us that he was 95% sure that there was no cancer. Two hours later we were in a room waiting for the Chemo Oncologist. Bad news, the cancer was back. Naomi has now started another round of Chemo treatments. This time she only goes one day a week and receives two different drugs. This will last for two months and then she faces another scan.

SHOCKEY DNA Project

The **SHOCKEY** DNA Project is part of the Family Tree DNA. Descendants who carry the bloodlines from John Christopher **Shockey** belong to Haplogroup Q. Those who have had more extensive testing show that we belong to the Q1b1a subclade which is quite rare in comparison to other groups.

We now have forty members in the **Shockey** DNA Project. Of these, twenty nine men have their DNA tested and nineeen are males with either the Shockey surname or persons who match the Shockey DNA. There are seven women who were born with the Shockey surname and have taken part in the mtDNA testing. There are twelve in the group that have taken advantage of the Family Finder test, nine men and three women. With all the women who had ask about this test to prove their Shockey ancestry and to determine which line they belong to, I was expecting many to take advantage of this test once it was in operation.

I am the only family member to take advantage of the Y-DNA 111 marker test. We do have twenty five who have tested the Y-DNA 67 marker test. Due to a change in the Deep Clade testing, they now only consider one to have taken the test instead of the six that was listed for the Deep Clade test before. They do still show four of us with true sub-clade of Q1b1 or Q1b1a.



SANDYVILLE - Veterans, relatives and government officials gathered at Independence Cemetery Monday afternoon to dedicate the new veterans memorial there.

Randall Bare, newly elected chairman of the West Virginia Veterans Council, served as master of ceremonies for the dedication which included the singing of the Star Spangled Banner by veteran Roy Guthrie, the Pledge of Allegiance led by Bare, and the raising and lowering to half-mast of the American Flag by Gareth Smith of the Jackson County marine Corps League and the raising of the flags of the five Armed Service branches by Marine Corps League and other attending veterans.

U.S. Air Force Chaplain Jack Miller delivered keynote remarks calling on each of those in attendance to honor those who answered the call to duty to defend freedom who came before, who currently serve and who will serve in the future, and to remember the sacrifice and dedication of the American warrior.

Spectators were reminded by Bare of the stone-like resolve to keep our nation free represented by the dark granite of the new Independence Cemetery memorial and the blank space left following the listing of armed conflicts represented by veterans buried in the cemetery: American Civil War, Spanish American War, World War I, World War II, Korean War, Vietnam War, Granada, Beirut, Panama, Gulf War, Somalia, Yugoslavia, Afghanistan, Philippines, Liberia and Iraq.
