It has been over a year now since Naomi passed away. Last week her brother passed away and a day later I learned that Dennis Teagardin-Shockey had also passed away. The last time that I talked to him on the telephone he said he hoped to see me at the next reunion in Winchester. I was able to tell him that we had found the missing link to prove that he was a descendant of John Christopher Shockey. It took many years and several of us researching to finally find the missing generations.

I have had a couple of health issues in the past few months but hope that I am over the worst part of those. My back does not permit me to spend long hours at the computer as I have too often in the past. I tend to lend forward in my chair and that places too much pressure on my spinal column.

Marie, who has written at least the opening pages for the Newsletter for the past 41 years, is not able to contribute her usual articles this year. One of the two major problems is that her computer is down and she cannot send or receive email. Second she has lost the use of her right hand since her medical problems a year ago in December.

As indicated in the past two Newsletters the reunion this year will be held in Shockeyville or actually staying in Winchester. We have reserved 26 rooms at the Holiday Inn Express & Suites for June 28<sup>th</sup> through July 3<sup>rd</sup>. Their address is 142 Fox Ridge Lane, Winchester, VA. There are 8 king, 10 double queen, 4 queen suites, and four handicap rooms. The discount rate is \$70.00 for standard rooms and \$80.00 for suites plus 7.3% tax. Rooms not reserved by June 14<sup>th</sup> will be released to the public at the standard rate. In order to get the discount rate, guests must **call 540-667-7050** and specify **Shockey Family Reunion**. The meeting room will be open Thursday through Sunday. (Their cancellation policy is 30 days prior to your reservation.) I will be there to greet you and Marie hopes to be there later that day. The reunion is the only vacation some of us have. It is such a joy to spend time with our Shockey cousins.

The itinerary remains the same as in previous years when at Winchester/Shockeyville. We always have new cousins every year, so on Saturday we offer a tour of the Oakland cemetery, John Shockey's original cabin, the Oakland Post Office and end up at Shockeyville church about noon. Scott Luttrell will meet you there and give you the history of Shockeyville and the church. He usually includes some local history and a few humorous stories of the area and its people. He has always provided sandwiches, iced tea and lemonade at no charge. A donation to the church is appreciated.

On Sunday we attend church services at the church followed by a picnic lunch and the general meeting. After that we take a group picture in front of the church. We plan to provide the lunch again for \$10.00 per person, kids under six are free. If the cost of the food exceeds our budget, we may have to charge a dollar or two more. Marie plans to have her two grandsons do the work. We just give them the menu and money to pay for it and they take it from there.

On Monday we do the Maryland/Pennsylvania tour. Paul Browne will be leading the tour again this year. ## **SHOCKEY Genealogy Updates**

Once again I have not had as much time to spend on the **Shockey Family database** as what I would like. There seems to be something to do all the time and it sure takes me longer to accomplish jobs each year. I do add to the data as time permits. It is always a really big help when family show up at annual reunion with their branch of the family prepared and with a GEDCOM to make the import of the data easy. **Having your database well documented will bring big smiles from any genealogist.**

**Remember to bring your family photographs that can be scanned and entered into the database.** If you do not have a database that can be exported by a GEDCOM, at least be sure to bring additions or corrections to the reunion. Make notes of dates and places in order to insure that we enter the correct information. Too much information is always better than not enough.

We currently have 22,098 names in the master database and 7,902 families. There are 29,318 events listed (births, deaths, marriages and burials and over 1,000 photos that are attached to one or more persons. A big thank you for all the individuals who submit information to add to the database.

We currently have 110 subscribers on the email list. Other addresses have either gone bad and a new address was not been subscribed or their research questions were answered. There is not too much posted to the mail list except when the Newsletter is made available and near annual reunion time.

### **SHOCKEY-SCHACKE DNA PROJECT**

There is currently 56 individuals who have had their DNA tested are listed on the SHOCKEY-SCHACKE DNA PROJECT. There are 32 individuals who have taken the test for Y-DNA. Only 6 have tested the 111 marker level and another 22 have tested 67 marker. I am the only one of the group that has tested on the BIG-Y test. I have 40 close matches on this test but the surnames do puzzle me as I cannot see their names as having derived from our Ancestral surnames (SCHACKE, JAGGI, JACKY and the one farthest back of JACOB. I do match the other 5 that have taken the 111 marker test so there is no doubt that I am a descendant of Johann Christoffel. The surnames that I match the closest on the BIG-Y test include Zimmerman, Birzu, Al-Iraqi,

Herbst, Baysinger and Engers. All of these surnames I do match 26,000 to 27,317 SNPs with no known SNP differences.

There are 21 people who have taken the Family Finder test and almost every day I am notified of one or more of those matching another cousin. Among those who have many matches is Charlotte Shockey with 1,998 matches and Kaylene Silvester with 2,184 matches. I currently have 2,800 matches but there are only a few of those that I can find the genealogy connection. We only have 8 men who have taken the Family Finder test. We need at least descendants of Valentine and of Samuel Christian to have the Family Finder test also to help the female descendants prove which line they descend from. There are also 21 who have taken the mtDNA which traces the maternal side of one's family. However we do not have a female descendant (daughter's daughter's daughter, etc.) of one of Christoffel's daughter so this does not help the Project.

### WikiTree's 1st Source-a-Thon

Charlotte Shockey (Isaac line) competed in WikiTree's 1st Source-a-Thon from October 1-3, 2016. She came in 2nd place with 1,018 profiles sourced and received the Winner badge for being in the Top 10. Her "Great Lakes Team" came in 4th place. Charlotte was lucky by her bib #105 being called during one of the many hangouts over the weekend and won a FREE FamilyTreeDNA Family Finder test! She also was invited to join in the actual hangout on the last day.



A few days later Charlotte became a Greeter on WikiTree. She was told by the project leader, Julie, if Charlotte hadn't volunteered that she (Julie) would have asked her to join the Greeter group. The Greeters are those who welcome new members to WikiTree, help with any issues that a member may have, and confirm them if they Volunteer.

Of course with the very few options available on the original Ancestry program, I still have a LOT of cleaning up to do as instead of events my old program had "notes" for anything other than birth, marriage, baptism, death, and burial but it is well worth it! I ended up purchasing the full program when I saw this wonderful tool called "color code people"... I started coloring lines so that I wouldn't stray too far from my main line.

Then there's that wonderful "swap spouses" feature that I'm in love with. You don't have to worry about unconnecting or deleting someone to fix where the person sits if you accidentally made a male a female, which surprisingly can happen! RootsMagic has completely changed my way of thinking on doing my family tree on my computer.

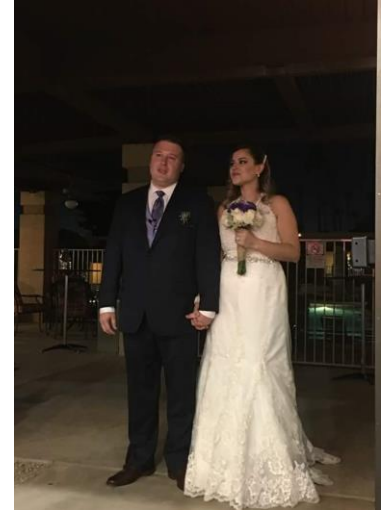
I love how I can share events instead of putting them on each person (didn't see that til a couple of months ago – more clean up!). Or, using Alternative names to find women under their married name.

## Athlete of the Week: Central's Shockey stellar in starting tailback debut

WOODSTOCK – Carston Shockey made his first-ever start at tailback for Central last week and he made the most of his debut.

The Central senior scored four touchdowns and rushed for over 100 yards against Skyline. Shockey said he wouldn't have had the success he had without the help of his teammates.

"It was a good game on everybody's part, Shockey said. "The line did a great job. My fullback, Matt Bromley, did a great job. Just everybody – they did what they had to do and I guess that's just how we won."

Shockey, The Northern Virginia Daily's Male Athlete of the Week for the week of Aug. 22-28, carried the ball 24 times for 118 yards and the Falcons beat Skyline, 34-13, in the season opener for both teams.

Shockey said that he's always nervous before a game, but he was feeling some extra nerves before the game against Skyline. "It's just like every game after the opening kickoff, all your nerves just seem to go away, Shockey said.

Central coach Mike Yew said he was very pleased with how Shockey performed.

"We had a game plan to try to pound out and try to run the ball," Yew said. "I don't know how many times he carried it in the first half, I would say about 20, but he responded real well. He had a nice game. He hit the holes hard and kept moving his feet. I'm really proud of him."

Shockey played at wide receiver and tailback last season. He said that he was able to learn a lot from some of the tailbacks before him such as Central graduates Hank Hoover and Daniel Molina.

"Just ever since I was on the (junior varsity) team I could watch them and see what they do," Shockey said. "I watched what they would do in certain situations, and I would just learn what kind of moves they would use. They'd give me pointers."

Now it's Shockey who is giving the pointers. The senior said during the game he was trying to help out some of the younger players on the team, especially the wide receivers. The Falcons have 24 sophomores on the team, and Shockey said he was impressed with how they played in their first varsity game.

"I feel like they did really good," Shockey said. "I'm really proud of all the young guys. They came out here and they showed us what they could do, and they proved to us that they're able to play at this level of play. It's good news for us older guys as well as the coaches. For those younger guys to show us how well they can do in a game."

Shockey said the performance he had at tailback also gives him a little more confidence of what he can do this season. He also played at safety against Skyline, after playing at cornerback for the last two seasons. Shockey said he was happy with how he did on defense, but knows there's room for improvement.

"I guess in the Page (County) scrimmage I was still trying to get used to the safety position, but now that we're into game week I feel like I've learned the material and now I'm really starting to apply it," Shockey said. "I feel like I've learned a lot, and I'm in a better position now than I was a couple weeks ago."



The Falcons play at Shenandoah County rival Stonewall Jackson on Friday, and Shockey said the Falcons need to keep improving.

“I expect it to be a good game. We definitely need to come out focused and ready to play,” Shockey said. “We can’t be content with what we had this past Friday. We need to go out there and be even better, play even better than we did.”

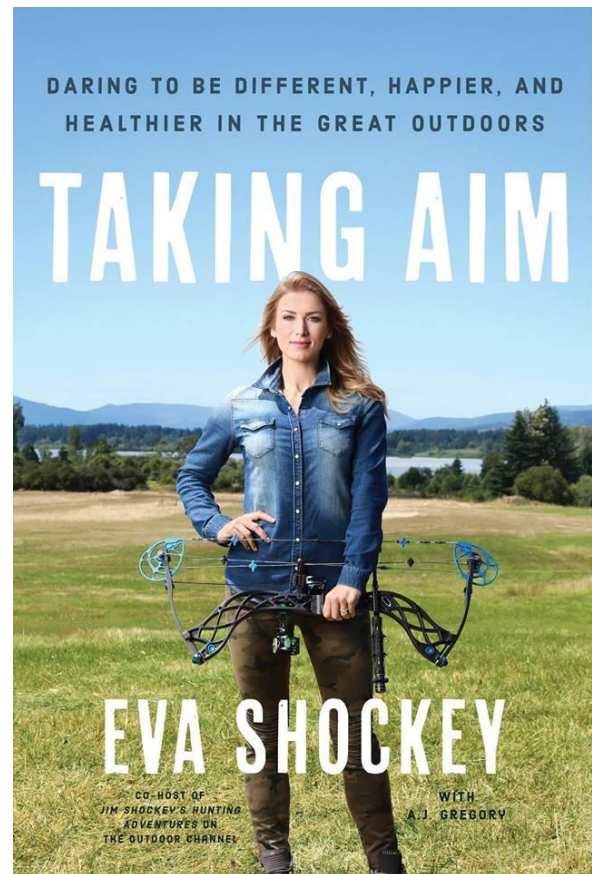

## Christian vs. Christian Christopher

Last reunion there was talk about the two Christian's: Valentine's son Christian (abt 1756-18 Apr 1829) and Johann's son Christian Christopher (10 Sep 1756-11 Dec 1779).

Several of us believe the Christian who married Mary Ann Welsh is actually the son of Valentine not his brother as the books have listed. They were born around the same time and so it got a little confusing. So if you thought you descended from the Christian line it would actually be the Valentine line.

Corp. Christian Christopher Shockey (son of Johann) was actually hung on 11 Dec 1779 leaving behind a wife and three children. (see that portion of the book on [www.wikitree.com/wiki/Shockey-42](http://www.wikitree.com/wiki/Shockey-42) ). The portion of the book that pertains to him (on the link listed) states he is the brother of Valentine, Isaac, and Abraham who are counterfeiters.

Now a couple of us believe that the wife and 3 children may actually be Rosanna (who later married Jacob Shilling; father may be a John King Sr.) and the children being: John (abt 1775-17 Jan 1859), Henry (abt 1779-6 Apr 1859) , and Mary (married Jacob B Smith Sr.). No definite proof on that, yet. John's death index record does state Christopher as his father and Rosanna as his mother. Sharon tried to find a death certificate or index for Henry in the Floyd Co. area or whatever county it would have been at his death and they didn't have any records. We still don't know where Mary went to and passed to check her's.

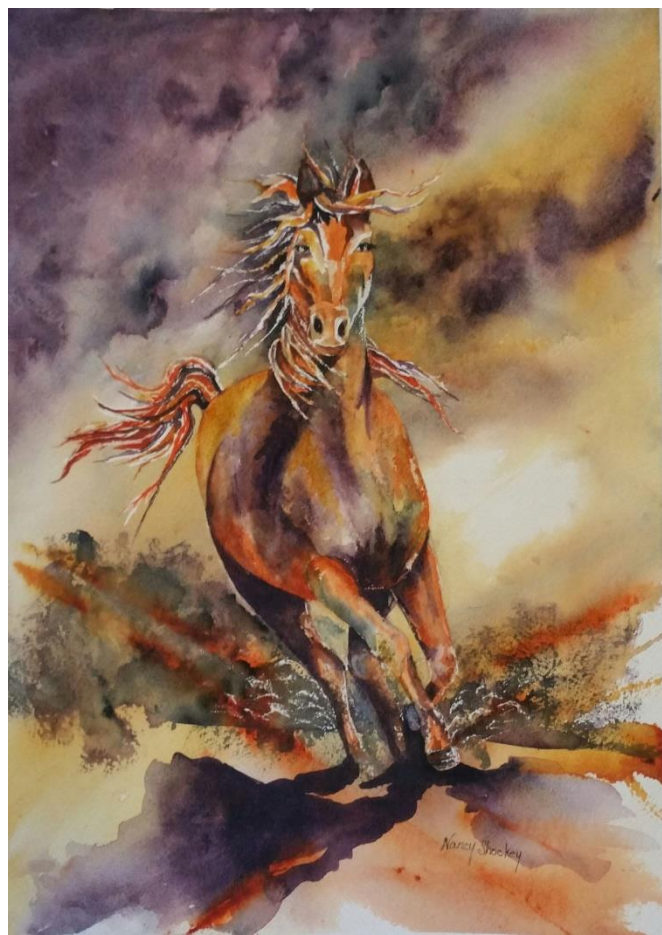

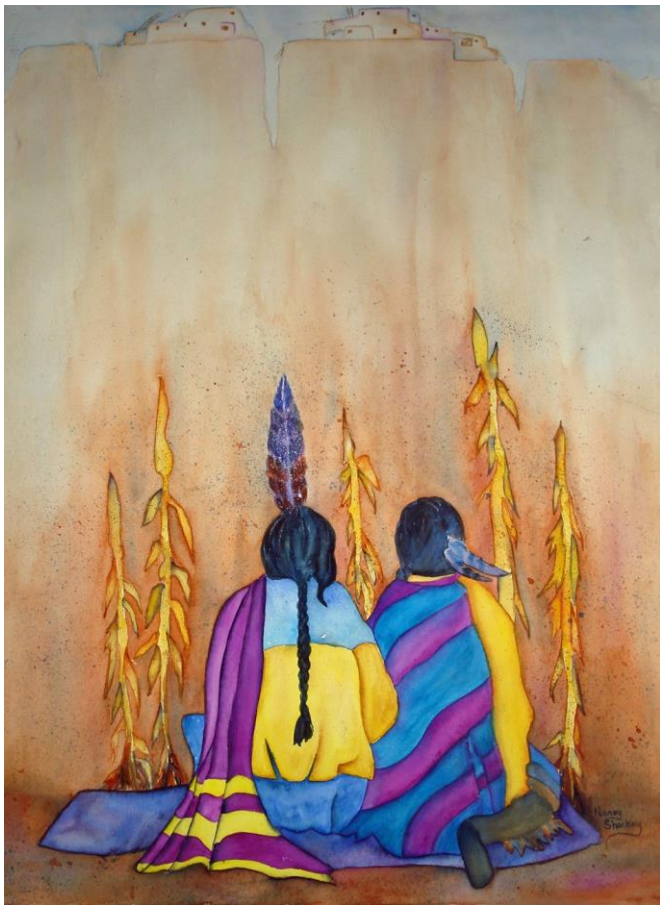

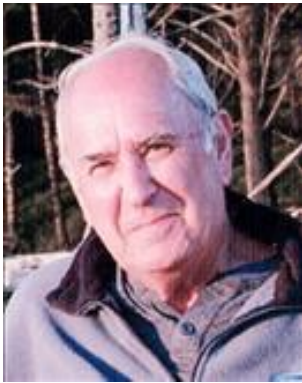
