Another year has passed by and it again time to compose the Shockey Newsletter and to make plans on attending our Shockey reunion once again. It will be good to see the many friends that we have met over the years and look forward to the new relatives that we will meet at this year's reunion. I have been trying to make arrangements for this year's reunion but with living 225 miles away it has not been an easy task.

I truly hate to start another Newsletter reporting on my health issues but again it seems necessary to do so. Only ten days after last year's reunion I had emergency gall bladder surgery. It turns out that it was septic and the surgeon said that I would not have lived out the weekend without the surgery. It was performed on July 14th and I was released the next day. Twenty four hours later I was back in the hospital with a very high temperature. It turns out that I had developed E-COLI. It took six days to find the antibiotics that would take care of the infection. It was a new strain of E-COLI called ESBL and the surgeon said that I had only recently appeared the largest surgical operating centers but never in West Virginia. It appears that my luck continues.

I spoke to Marie on the telephone a few days ago. Her email is still not working and so she cannot contribute her article. She continues to do very well for someone who is over 95 years old. Later in this Newsletter will appear an article that her son sent me about her.

SHOCKEY Genealogy Updates

Once again I have not had as much time to spend on the **Shockey Family database** as what I would like. There seems to be something to do all the time and it sure takes me longer to accomplish jobs each year. I do add to the data as time permits. It is always a really big help when family show up at annual reunion with their branch of the family prepared and with a GEDCOM to make the import of the data easy. **Having your database** well documented will bring big smiles from any genealogist.

Remember to bring your family photographs that can be scanned and entered into the database. If you do not have a database that can be exported by a GEDCOM, at least be sure to bring additions or corrections to the reunion. Make notes of dates and places in order to insure that we enter the correct information. Too much information is always better than not enough.

We currently have 22,800 names in the master database and 8,146 families. There are 31,000 events listed (births, deaths, marriages and burials and over 1,034 photos of persons or tombstones that are attached to one or more persons. Thank you for all the individuals who submit information to add to the database.

SHOCKEY-SCHACKE DNA PROJECT


There is currently 62 individuals who have had their DNA tested are listed on the SHOCKEY-SCHACKE DNA PROJECT. Some members have also taken part in other company DNA tests.

With the Family Tree DNA Project there are 36 individuals who have taken the test for Y-DNA. Three of the members have taken the Big-Y test. Seven have tested the 111 marker level and another 30 have tested 67 marker. On the Big-Y test I have 40 close matches on this test but the surnames do puzzle me as I cannot see their names as having derived from our Ancestral surnames (SCHACKE, JAGGI, JACKY and the one farthest back of JACOB. I do match the other 5 that have taken the 111 marker test so there is no doubt that I am a descendant of Johann Christoffel.

There are now 24 people who have taken the Family Finder test and almost every day I am notified of one or more of those matching another cousin. Among those who have many matches is Charlotte Shockey with 3,030 matches and Kaylene Silvester with 3,256 matches. I currently have 4,131 matches but there are only a few of those that I can find the genealogy connection. We now have 20 men who have taken the Family Finder test.

NO JOURNEY'S TOO LONG WHEN IT COMES TO EDUCATION



How far would you commute for an education? By the time the current school year is over, Kent Silvester, 66, and LeRoy Musick, 76, both of Imperial, will have driven about 16,000 miles.

The two men are learning about classic car restoration at Mid-Plains Community College (MPCC) in North Platte. The route they take to get there is 100 miles, one way.

"It's about an hour and 35 minutes unless we have to stop for a train or slow down for deer," said Musick.

"Because we're on Mountain Time and the college is on Central Time, we have to leave Imperial around 5 a.m," he said.

They make the drive five days a week, often stopping

along the way to pick up donuts for the rest of the class. Despite being time-consuming, the journey is one they always look forward to.

"The auto body program is a lot of fun, which is what we're taking it for," said Silvester. "It's common to reach a crossroads after retirement, and start to wonder, 'Do I buy a new recliner, or do I get out and do something?' This program has really helped me keep active," Silvester said.

It's also put him in touch with a lot of new friends with similar interests, such as Musick. The two had been acquaintances for a long time. They met because Silvester used to frequent a restaurant owned by Musick in Imperial. However, it wasn't until last summer that they really bonded over cars.

Silvester had been taking night classes through the college since January 2016 in an attempt to restore a 1970 Chevelle super sport 454 that had been sitting in his quonset for 25 years.

"I thought I could fix it up pretty quickly, but the more I got into it, the more damage I found," said Silvester. "The front fenders and rear quarter panels were bad, the wheel wells were rusted and the interior had been destroyed by mice and raccoons," he noted.

Realizing the project would take more work than he originally thought, Silvester decided to enroll in the Auto Body Technology program full time in the fall. He then went on the hunt for someone to travel with, both for the company and to split the cost of gas.

Silvester knew Musick liked classic cars because he had seen him at car shows. He also knew Musick had a vehicle he was trying to fix up, a 1941 Mercury Convertible, purchased in pieces out of Missouri.
