It is with a heavy heart that I am starting to write this Newsletter. Marie F. Shockey passed away on November 18, 2019. My son, Keith, came to West Virginia and went to Winchester, Virginia with me to her funeral. Marie and husband, Ralph N. Shockey, spent many years locating and interviewing every Shockey family that they could find across the United States. I talked to Marie several times each year, asking for advice or more information regarding some Shockey relative. She was a wealth of information and an excellent memory to the end.

In January I learned that Captain Daniel N. Shockey, 94, had also passed away. He had served as Vice President of the Shockey Family Memorial Fellowship, Inc. for many years and one of the original signers of the Incorporation papers. Dan called me a few times each year usually asking me to mail him a copy of the year's Shockey Newsletter, asking about the year's reunion or wanting to know where the next reunion would be held.

Marie and Dan, as well as a few others, worked hard to establish the annual reunions and the Shockey Family Memorial Fellowship, Inc. and I will miss talking to each of them and receiving their advice.

RINGING OF MAGIE'S BELL –Scott rang Magies bell

PRAYER – David (AR) provided a prayer.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE – All

MEMORIAL – David read the names of those that have passed since the last reunion and Les called for a moment of silence in their memory.

INTRODUCTION OF BOARD MEMBERS PRESENT – Les had board members introduce themselves.

REAFFIRMATION OF BOARD MEMBERS – David asked the general membership for a reaffirmation of the present board members and Marie, in absentia. The call to the membership yielded approval with no descending. Motion made by David and seconded by Bud.

The **Shockey** Email list located on the Rootsweb.Ancestry.com server closed March 2, 2020 as Rootsweb terminated all lists. The new address to send an item to the mailing list is: Shockey@groups.io

We had 116 subscribers on the email list on February 4th when the change started. 34 signed up the first day that I announced the new list.

SHOCKEY-SCHACKE DNA PROJECT

There is currently 72 individuals who have had their DNA tested are listed on the SHOCKEY-SCHACKE DNA PROJECT. Some members have also taken part in other company DNA tests.

With the Family Tree DNA Project there are 38 individuals who have taken the test for Y-DNA. Five of the members have taken the Big-Y test. Eight have tested the 111 marker level and another 24 have tested 67 marker. (This is the corrected number.)

On the Big-Y test I have 40 close matches on this test but the surnames do puzzle me as I cannot see their names as having derived from our Ancestral surnames (SCHACKE, JAGGI, JACKY and the one farthest back of JACOB. I do match the other 4 that have taken the 111 marker test so there is no doubt that I am a descendant of Johann Christoffel.

There are now 24 people who have taken the Family Finder test and almost every day I am notified of one or more of those matching another cousin. Among those who have many matches is Charlotte Shockey with 4,346 matches and Kaylene Silvester with 4,692 matches. I currently have 5,918 matches but there are only a few of those that I can find the genealogy connection. We now have 23 men who have taken the Family Finder test and 15 women for a total of 38 persons.

My test shows that I am Haplogroup Q-BZ6. This changed as result of the upgrades in my test. At the Y-DNA67 level it shows a Haplogroup of Q-M242, at the Y-DNA111 is shows a Haplogroup of Q-YP1095. Q-BZ6 is a subgroup of Q-M242 and the tests prove it.
