Minutes of the Shockey Family Reunion General Meeting, Augusta GA July 3, 2022

Scott Luttrell rang Maggie's bell with Vice-President Will Shockey calling the meeting to order.

The meeting was opened with Chaplain David Shockey leading in prayer.

Jimmy Shifflett was recognized for assisting Scott Luttrell with the work at Shockeysville Church.

Message from past President David Shockey (Kentucky) via telephone at the Board Meeting:

- Work to preserve Shockeysville Church
- Work to preserve data and information for easy transfer between board members.

Secretary/Treasurer Report:

- No quorum of board members was present at the 2021 Reunion in August, Georgia: no board meeting was held. The minutes for the General Assembly meeting were published in the newsletter.
- Toni Shockey presented the estimated treasurer's report (with the transfer of officers, no bank statements have been available): estimated ending balance \$2,618.88 (including cash and balance in the bank).

Newsletter:

• Charlotte Shockey states that 80 pages were available on the website with the majority of the pages being obituaries. The newsletter is not being mailed at this time.

Genealogist:

- Bud Roseberry advised we have received 53,620 entries from Les Shockey's database. He
 and Charlotte are co-administrators of the database and are in the process of combining
 their databases.
- The database is now at 60.030 entries.

DNA testing – 81 people have been tested. \$200 was previously donated to help fray the cost of DNA testing.

Church Report:

- Scott Luttrell advised the church is unofficially closed due to low membership and attendance.
- The Shockey & Luttrell Memorial Fund has been applying for and receiving grants that are covering the cost of the church upkeep.
- \$2,600 has been received for the bathroom addition. He is working on funding ideas and plans to present a request to the Winchester Eagles Club.
- The projects scheduled for this year are:
 - Blown insulation in the ceiling.
 - o Removing one of the big oak trees.

Website:

Charlotte Shockey advised that a Shockey website has been created. The various sections
created to date are about us, upcoming reunion, past reunions, history Shockey tours,
newsletters, donation page.

Shockeysville property:

• The Board Members reached a consensus that they wished to keep the five acres and not sell the acreage. Scott Luttrell advised that the property is currently zoned as agriculture and would need to be re-zoned if we wished to build something there in the future.

501 C-3:

• The Board discussed looking into the possibility of the Foundation becoming a 501 C-3. They have looked into it in the past, but no one remembered why one had never been formed. Wayne Vincent advised it might facilitate donations. The board asked him to look into the possibility along with Toni Shockey.

Digital Red Books:

The Board discussed permission to create a digital version of the Red Book. Once clearance
is granted by Ralph Shockey and David Shockey - the heirs of Ralph and Marie Shockey the Board will proceed with the plans. Discussion of selling the USB drives as merchandise
items for \$15 was mentioned.

The General Assembly voted to accept the reports as stated.

Bylaws:

- The changes recommended by Paul Browne were adopted:
 - Article I Offices to read Stephenson, Virginia (previously Copper Hill, Virginia).
 - o Article III Board of Directors 3. Regular Meeting
 - Add when possible A regular meeting of the Board of Directors shall be held annually when possible in conjunction with the annual meeting/reunion of members.
 - Article III Board of Directors 4. Special Meetings
 - Add email or video teleconferencing without such a physical gathering by making use of the public telephone, the U.S. Postal Service, e-mail or video teleconferencing.
- The General Assembly voted to accept the by-law changes as presented.

The board members recommend we begin coming to Winchester every three years. The following invitations have been accepted pending approval by the General Assembly:

- 2023 in San Antonio, TX
- 2024 in Fort Collins, CO
- 2025 in Winchester, VA 50th anniversary

The General Assembly voted to accept the future reunion sites as presented.

Board Member transitions:

- Two Board Members passed away this year: Les Shockey (Ohio) and John Shockey (Arkansas).
- Ralph Shockey (Maryland) presented his resignation as a Board Member.
- Paul Browne (Maryland) presented his resignation as a Board Member.

The General Assembly voted to accept the resignations.

Keith Shockey made a motion to authorize Secretary/Treasurer Toni Shockey to open a new bank account for the Shockey Family Memorial Fellowship, Inc. with Secretary/Treasurer Toni Shockey and Vice-President David Shockey as authorized signers. Charlotte Shockey second the motion. Motion carried.

Suggestions to be brought before the General Assembly:

- T-shirt design contest for the 50th anniversary. The design will need to be submitted by the 2023 reunion. (Due to the need to submit a new t-shirt design.)
- Sale of decorated water bottles as donations for the church bathroom fund (Rhonda has volunteered her daughter.)

The General Assembly agreed to move forward with the suggestions.

Wayne Vincent led a discussion regarding next year's reunion to be hosted in San Antonio, Texas.

JAMES EDWARD BERRY



Dolores (Dee), born on her mother's 17th birthday, was a birthday present and life-long gift to her family and friends. The oldest of seven siblings, she helped raise her brothers and sisters during the Great Depression, learning how to cook on a wood-fired stove, ironing and cleaning the house by the age of five while her mother and father worked on their Walla Walla truck farm, raising sweet onions, carrots, and spinach. Born into poverty, new clothes were a rarity, consisting of hand-sewn donations from a local charity. She often missed school to care for family members and felt humiliated when she overheard her teachers talking about her difficult family life. Still, the difficult circumstances helped her become a strong and caring woman determined to create a better life for her family.

Indeed, she lived the American Dream and ensured her children did as well.

The first member of her family to graduate from high school, she went to work for the Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company as a switchboard operator. During this time, she agreed to go on a blind date and met her future husband, Charles "Chuck" M. Lund. Unimpressed at first by the (almost) bald young man who knocked on her door, his charisma and worldliness—along with four years of long-distance dating while he attended college—convinced her that he was "the one." They married in October, 1955, and children quickly followed, with Mary Ann, born in 1956, Eric in 1958, and Michael in 1963.

Dee thought she would live the rest of her life in Pasco, Washington, where Chuck took a job with Sears. Life consisted of work during the week and visiting her family in Walla Walla every weekend. Married life, however, soon found her moving from one town to another as Chuck took a job with the federal government. They were transferred regularly from one duty station to

another, including a long stint in Spokane from 1964 to 1972. She hated the moves! Even so, each was executed perfectly with as little disruption to the children's lives as possible. Her dream of living in one place for a long time finally came true when they moved back to Spokane in 1994 to be close to grandchildren. She was everything one would expect from an Italian grandmother.

Dee inherited her father's skill at math, and returned to work in the early '70's as a bank teller in order to pay her children's college tuition. She enjoyed the work well enough to spend the next 20 years working in banks, long after all three had earned degrees.

Returning to Spokane in the '90s allowed her to reconnect with old friends, including her Beta Sigma Phi "sisters." Prior to the Covid-19 years, Dee was also active in the St. Mary Catholic Parish, participating in a Bible Study group, Women at the Well, and the Loving Care Ministry.

Dee never stopped learning or trying new things. Terrified of water, she took swimming lessons as an adult and learned to float. Seeing how much fun the family had on the ski slopes, she took lessons in her forties so she could enjoy the bunny hill while the family skied the mountain. Expecting her life to be lived within the confines of Walla Walla County, she and Charles became world travelers, with three trips to Italy and Europe, and numerous trips to Mexico. Road trips across the US were a given, to visit relatives and the sights. It was a major disappointment when she could no longer drive across the state to visit her children in her 80s.

Dolores was predeceased by her beloved husband, Charles M.
