- Wayne shared that Rhonda is continuing to work on the 501C3 setup. Currently we could accept
 donations through a gentlemen's 501C3 in her office, but a fee would be incurred. If we can wait a bit, her
 501C3 will not assess a fee for the Shockey donations through this process
- We need to change the password for PayPal, now that Toni has moved on.
- Conference room quoted cost for the 2024 Reunion may have gone up and we'll need to reimburse Valerie for this in the process of settling 2024 Reunion site costs
- Will shared that the website cost will be approximately \$227, but will confirm first, based on his receipt records

- Genealogy Project is currently finishing the John Shockey line and will be working on the Valentine line
- Will Shockey moved to accept the Genealogy report. David Shockey seconded. Board voted to accept the report.

SHOCKEY RESEARCH & DNA

This last year was a great year for Shockey discoveries and research. We published the Christopher report at the end of 2023 and had great feedback. We published the John report at the end of 2024. The research from these two reports has borne much fruit. I also finished my Hall of John Shockey document which details what we've found on 60 different men named John Shockey who were born before 1850. I also issued updates on the Hall of Christopher/Christian and Hall of Abraham Shockey documents. The biggest revelations:

- John's name was just John Shockey ... not John Aaron ... not John Christopher Shockey
- We discovered records for John's son, David (and his son Abraham), and a tax record mentioning John's son, Isaac
- We made a significant swap between two John Shockey men who were born around 1818. Both
 were the grandson and great-grandson of John Shockey (c.1742 c.1822), and one of them was
 the founder of Shockeysville

The ThruLines project focused on the descendants of John Shockey. We now have four participants who descend from John. We have established evidence for 21 of his 27 known grandchildren, though 8 of these 21 lines are scantily represented.

Our Y-DNA testing brought significant breakthroughs with 2 new tests and 1 upgrade.

- Christopher's son, Henry, was likely the son of a Mr. Neff and was probably not Christopher's biological child. It is possible that the non-paternal event took place with Henry's son, Madison (c.1823), or his grandson Charles Madison (1875). More testing is needed.
- We've discovered a few early DNA variants. Three of them have been pinpointed to Valentine Shockey, Sr. (c.1739 – 1810), John Shockey, Sr. (c.1742 – c.1822), and Christian Shockey, Sr. (1756 – 1829).
- Abraham Shockey (1788/93 1863) has now been proven to be the son of Christian Shockey, Sr. (1756 1829). I believe that his dates are probably incorrect on his headstone. He was likely born in 1793, not 1788; and his age was exaggerated later in his life (like some other Shockey siblings)
- John Valentine Shockey (1810-1899) was probably the descendant of Valentine Shockey, but not through Valentine's son, Christian (as I had hypothesized before). Perhaps he was the son of Valentine, Jr., or Isaac.

SHOCKEY-SCHACKE DNA PROJECT

We have so much information coming thanks to Jeff Niles that I had to create a separate Newsletter just for the DNA information he figured out from the Y-DNA. I am happy to announce the publication of our second DNA Newsletter will be in the next month or so. Link can be found on the website under newsletters: https://shockeyfamilyfellowshipinc.com/newsletters I will send out an announcement when it is available.

We have lines that we need testers for which will be in the newsletter. Also, trying to figure out lines via autosomal DNA as well so females can still participate.

Also, if you have **AncestryDNA** we would love it if you could download your raw DNA and upload to FTDNA as well as GEDMatch. Then invite Jeff to your AncestryDNA to check out the Thrulines. Instructions on all are in the newsletter at the back.

We are also looking for donations to help fray the costs for some testers, please see the donation button listed on the FamilyTreeDNA project page. Later in the year I plan to sell DNA Ornaments to go towards the DNA Donations for tests. So please keep an eye out on the Shockey Roots page as well as the email group.

Goals for mt-DNA

Testing Starting in 2025 and 2026, we would love to start developing DNA testing on the matriarchal lineages within the Shockey family. If you or your mother descend directly through a mother to daughter-daughter-daughter relationship from Shockey women, then you are a candidate for mitochondrial DNA testing with the Shockeys. This is also open to men as long as your mother was a direct matriarchal descendant, because you carry your mother's mt-DNA but cannot pass it on. I would like to start cataloging mt-DNA relationships and haplogroups for Shockey daughters and the wives of Shockey sons. There is a potential here for determining some new surnames. We may even be able to determine if some Shockey brothers married women who were sisters to each other. Could there be some other Bixler, Freed, King, Yerger, Welsh, Jones, Crabb, Hoyle, Catlett, Secrist, Rector, Casseldine, or Simpson women who married a Shockey in the 1700s?

Goals for Y-DNA Testing

The following are some goals for testing the 7 sons of Johann Christoffel Schacke and his grandsons. Understand that these are long-term goals that detail which branches would be helpful to paint a bigger picture of the Shockey lineages. Tests can get expensive, but our hope is that a few more individuals will participate now and lay down a foundation for others who hopefully will be able to purchase Y-DNA tests at a more affordable price in the next 10-20 years.

Valentine Shockey, Sr.: (1 new Y-DNA test in 2024)

Valentine's line is the best tested Shockey lineage with 12 tests, including 6 Big Ys, so the Y-DNA of Valentine himself is rather well established. Valentine did have a variant (10 alleles) on marker DYS507 (Y-700) which gives us a great litmus test for determining if someone descends from this branch. Further testing of Valetine's descendants will primarily help us understand his sons' lineages.

Abraham Shockey (1755 – 1861): 2 Big Ys

- Need Y-67+ from the lineages of <u>Valentine</u> and <u>Joseph</u>.
- Further testing (Y-37+) from <u>John's</u> lineage will probably help identify the timing of a variant for this line. John's lineage also has multiple Big Y variants and has great potential for mapping out several generations of DNA variants.

Christian Shockey, Sr. (1756 – 1829): 3 Tests (1 Y-67 and 2 Big Ys)

- Need Y-67+ from the lineages of William and Levi.
- Further testing (Y-67+) from <u>Abraham's</u> lineage will probably help identify the timing of multiple variants for this line. There is a grant available for more research on this Abraham's lines.

Valentine Shockey, Jr. (c.1757 – c.1800): 0 Tests

• Need any test (Y-67+) to represent this branch.

Isaac Shockey (c.1762 – c.1817): 0 Tests

• Need any test (Y-67+) to represent this branch. Did he and Mary Agnes have children?

Joseph Shockey (c.1767 – 1861): 6 Tests (2 Y-37, 2 Y-67, and 2 Big Ys)

- Need Y-67+ from the lineage of <u>Daniel</u>.
- Need any proof for <u>Valentine</u>, <u>Levi</u> and <u>Joseph Jr</u>. Is there evidence that these three sons existed?

Any testing from the descendants of Abraham (c.1784-1865) who settled in Beaver County, PA would be awesome. I believe he was may have been a descendant of Valentine based on some early autosomal data.

We also need further testing (Y-111+) from the lineage of John Valentine Shockey (1819-1899) to help determine which of Valentine's sons was his grandfather.

Rumored Shockey men – did they exist? Edward (1761), Jacob (1766), and Lewis (1773)

John Shockey, Sr.: (1 Big Y upgrade in 2024)

John's line has good representation with 5 tests, including 2 Big Ys, so the Y-DNA of John himself is also well established. John did have a variant (18 alleles) on marker DYS557 (Y-67) which also gives us a great litmus test for determining if someone descends from this branch.

Jacob Shockey, Sr. (bef.1765 – c.1817): 1 Test (Y-67)

- Need Y-67+ from the lineages of Basil, Lewis, and Jacob Jr.
- Another Y-37+ test from <u>John's</u> lineage will help identify the timing of a peculiar variant for his line.

John Shockey, Jr. (1764 – 1837): 2 Tests (Y-67 and 1 Big Y)

- Need Y-67+ from the lineages of <u>James</u>, <u>John III</u>, <u>Isaac</u>, and <u>Stephen</u>
- The Big Y test from this lineage has several private variants; one or more of these may have originated with John Jr. himself. Another Big Y test from the lineages of the above sons could establish that John Jr. was the progenitor of a new haplotype.

David Shockey (1777 – c.1809): 0 Tests

• Need any test (Y-67+) to represent this branch. <u>Abraham</u> was their only son. Did Abraham and Martha Barker have any sons, or was Mary Ellen their only child?

Lewis Shockey (c.1782 – 1852): 2 Tests (Y-67 and 1 Big Y)

- Need Y-67+ from the lineages of <u>John</u> and <u>Peter</u>
- Another Y-37+ test from <u>Darius'</u> lineage will help identify the timing of a peculiar variant for his line.

Isaac Shockey (Bet. 1791-1796 –): 0 Tests

Need any test (Y-67+) to represent this branch. Did he live long enough to marry?

Jacob Shockey, Sr.:

Jacob's line has only been tested twice: 2 Y-67 tests. One or two Big Y tests from his branch would help us determine more about Jacob himself as well as his descendants.

Jacob Shockey, Jr. (1770 – 1833): 0 Tests

- Need any test (Y-67+) to represent this branch from the lineages of <u>John II</u> and <u>David</u> (John I died in infancy; Jacob did not have children; Samuel only had 1 grandson that survived childhood but he died childless)
- Again, 1-2 Big-Ys needed as well for any of Jacob Sr.'s sons.

Isaac Shockey, Sr. (c.1774 – c.1843): 1 Test (Y-67)

- Need Y-67+ from the lineages of John, Samuel, Isaac Jr., Philip, Abraham, and David
- A Y-37+ test from <u>Jacob's</u> lineage could help identify the timing of 2 variants for his line.
- Again, 1-2 Big-Ys needed as well for any of Jacob Sr.'s sons.

Christian Shockey, Sr. (1775 – 1863): 1 Test (Y-67)

- Need Y-67+ from the lineages of <u>Jacob</u>, <u>Solomon</u>, <u>Christian Jr.</u> and <u>Abraham</u>
- Another Y-67+ test from <u>Elias'</u> lineage will help identify the timing of 2 variants for his line.
- Again, 1-2 Big- Ys needed as well for any of Jacob Sr.'s sons.

Isaac Shockey, Sr.: (1 Big Y upgrade in the lab for 2025)

Isaac's line has only been tested twice: 1 Y-111 test (upgrade to Big Y in the lab) and 1 Big Y-700 (plus a son's Y-37 test). There are 2 variants from the Big Y that could possibly have originated with Isaac himself, but more testing is needed to determine the timing. The test in the lab should tell us more soon.

Abraham Shockey, Sr. (1771 – 1846)

- Need Y-67+ from the lineages of <u>Charles</u> and <u>Abraham Jr.</u>
- Another Y-111+ test from <u>Isaac's</u> lineage will help identify the timing of 2 variants for his line. Y-111 tests from Charles and Abraham Jr. could also help.
- Need any proof for Philip and Weldon. Is there evidence that these sons existed?

Isaac Shockey, Jr. (1773 – 1844)

- Need Y-67+ from the lineages of <u>John</u>, <u>Samuel</u>, <u>William</u>, <u>Abraham</u>, and <u>Isaac III</u>
- Further testing (Y-37+) from <u>Henry's</u> lineage will help identify the timing of a variant for this line.

Abraham Shockey:

There is no Y-DNA participation from Abraham's branch yet. One or two Big-Y tests would be helpful to establish patterns on this branch. Any test would help.

Christian Shockey, Sr. (c.1778 – 1834)

Need Y-67+ from the lineages of George, Isaac, John, and Christian W, Jr.

• Again, 1-2 Big Ys would help identify characteristics for this line.

Christopher Shockey: (1 Big Y for Henry's non-biological line in 2024)

Christopher's line has only been tested three times, but two of these tests are from his grandson, Daniel's lineage: 2 Y-67 tests and 1 Big Y-700. We think that Daniel was the son of Christopher's son, John. Also, a Big-Y test from Henry's lineage has determined that he likely was not the biological son of Christopher. The NPE could possibly be with Henry's son or grandson.

A grant is available for testing from Christopher's descendants.

John Shockey, Sr. (c.1771-75 – 1859)

- Need Y-67+ from the lineages of Henry, Solomon (?), and John Jr. (?)
- Testing would be especially helpful for Solomon and John to prove that they were actually from this line. Could <u>Abraham</u> (c.1816-1847, who married the Peddicord sisters) also be his son?
- A Big-Y could help clarify the timing of some already noted variants and help us better understand Daniel's relationship to this family.

Henry Shockey (c.1776-80 – 1859)

- Need any test (Y-67+) to represent this branch from the lineages of <u>Alexander</u>, <u>Preston</u>, or <u>Jonathon</u> to help clarify the timing of the non-paternal event and the relationship of Neff genealogy to Henry's family. That is, was Mr. Neff the father of Henry, Madison, or Charles Madison Shockey?
- Need any proof for <u>James</u>. Is there evidence that this son existed?

Again, anything that might prove that Abram was Christopher's son. It's possible he died before having children anyway.

Samuel Christian Shockey:

There is no Y-DNA participation from Samuel Christian's branch yet. One or two Big-Y tests would be helpful to establish patterns on this branch. Any test would help do this.

Abraham Shockey (c.1808 – 1838)

- Need Y-67+ from the lineage of <u>Henry Christian</u>. This is the only Y-DNA line that we are aware of that descends from Samuel Christian and his son Abraham.
- Again, 1-2 Big Ys would help identify characteristics for this line.

History of the Shockey Reunions by Gerald Shockey

The Shockey Family Fellowship was started a few years after Ralph and Marie Shockey started hosting family reunions at Shockeysville. Several other reunions were hosted by other Shockey families.

Ralph and Marie would take a vacation and at each town (or it seemed that way) get a phone book and look for Shockeys. He would sometimes call and talk to the person who answered about genealogy. If he did not get an answer he would get the address and write a letter and enclose data sheets requesting information.

Early on he contacted Walda Ann Shockey Paris and she supplied about 5000 names and genealogy. She became active with them in the reunions and became a board member in the fellowship.

The following information is from newsletter number 2.

Honor those Shockeys who served. in the Revolutionary Army: Christian, Old. Abraham, Jacob, Jacob Jr., Abraham, Valentine, and Valentine's two sons, Edward and Abraham.

Richard Shockey arrived in America before Christopher? Thanks to Miss Ruth J. Shockey.

The first reunions were one day affairs.

We met Ralph and Marie in 1977 shortly after the TV show Roots came out. Our younger daughter (Sarah) was assigned the assignment to do some genealogy for her family. We had received a letter from Ralph with a family data sheet requesting our family information. We were living in Fairfax county VA at the time, so Ruth (my wife) called and Ralph invited us to come and visit. After visiting with them, I understand why he was able to gather information for the Red books. He was easy to talk to and very encouraging about genealogy.

At the time he had a stack of family data sheets, one for each son and each was about 6 inches tall on the table. This is the information they used to publish the Red books in 1981.

Shortly after the books were published, Ralph began thinking about a volume III to include new information and update areas in the books where they had new information. He also wanted to get some younger family members involved in the updates.

He also wanted to get the younger folks more involved in hosting the reunions.

The second was the same as the Monday trip when the reunion is held in Winchester. John C. Shockey of Pennsylvania first came to the 1978 reunion. Captain Dan Shockey of Virginia first came to a reunion in1975. Both John and Dan became very active, relieving Ralph and Marie of some of the responsibilities.

The family decided to begin looking to incorporate at the 1983 reunion. It was also decided to elect officers at the 1984 reunion. John C. Shockey was elected as Chairman and a treasurer and board members. It was decided to proceed with the incorporation of the family fellowship at the 1985 reunion.

At the 1986 reunion Capt. Dan Shockey of VA. was elected as a co-chairman with John C. Shockey of Pennsylvania.

Scott Luttrell has been a large supporter for the reunion. He coordinates and handles the maintenance and upgrades at the Shockeysville church. He has been involved in the construction of the shelters at the church.

Before the 1984 reunion Scott had overseen the construction of the first covered area across from the church. He is still involved in the maintenance and care of the church and grounds.

Ralph was planning on starting to organize volume III of the red books after the reunion in 1985.

It was decided to proceed with the incorporation of family fellowship. Ralph and Marie were publishing and mailing over 2000 newsletters each year. The reunions have become 2 day affairs.

At the 1988 reunion the fellowship was incorporated on Dec. 7, 1987. It was decided to assess a \$5.00 fee for membership to cover any expenses and to help defray some of the cost incurred by Ralph and Marie in producing and mailing the newsletters.

The 1988 reunion was one with a lot of sadness because Ralph had passed away on 25 June 1988. As a result the officers assumed more responsibility and Marie began publishing the newsletter herself. She continued to publish the newsletter until 2013. Les Shockey began helping Marie in 2008, but in 2013 Marie's computer died and she lost the address list, so the newsletter was published on the internet.

Ralph was a historian as well as a genealogist. He tried to include something about each person in the red books. Once he met you, you were a friend for life.

The officers for the fellowship were elected. John C. Shockey of PA. as president and Dan Shockey of VA. Was elected as vice president. A secretary and a treasurer and a board of directors was elected.

Discussion continued at the 1990 reunion about the purchase of land at Shockeysville. There was an update to the articles of the fellowship made. The board of directors was expanded. The 1991 newsletter has a copy of the certificate of registration for John Christopher Shockey from The Statue of Liberty-Ellis Island Foundation, Inc. to The American Immigrant Wall of Honor.

By 1992 the reunion had grown to four days. Each year when the reunion was held in Winchester, the Monday following the Sunday activities at Shockeysville a tour of several sites related to the Shockey family.

The discussion of purchase of land at Shockeysville was continued. Dan Shockey of VA gave a report on computerizing genealogy. He introduced Les Shockey and Bud Rosenberry, both of whom already had some information computerized. Both were added to the board.

Scott Luttrell led the project to place siding on the church at Shockeysville. A number of Scott's family and Les' father and brothers plus other volunteers finished most of the job on Saturday. A few finished the job Sunday after church. Several ladies furnished meals for the folks working on the siding. To see a list of all the volunteers see the 1995 newsletter.

Les selected the Family Origins program by 1995 to use to organize the genealogy data. By 1995 Les had 13150 names in the database.

Sue Dexheimer and Walda Ann Paris served several years on the board of directors for the fellowship.

Sue was one of the hosts for the 1996 reunion in Plano. John P. Shockey and I (Gerald Shockey) helped Pete Shockey with the Plano reunion.

This is the first time I met Les and Bud and it was like we had known each other for years.

John C. Shockey stated in the 1997 newsletter that a possible agreement to purchase 5 acres of land across the road from the church in Shockeysville. At the 1996 reunion and the1997 newsletter Les discussed starting to begin getting online for genealogy and communications of other fellowship information.

T-shirts and caps are now available at each of the reunions.

In the 1998 newsletter John C. Shockey described the purchase of the 5 acres of land near the church. An agreement had been reached and partial payment of the cost had been made. Also Les reported he had been able to make contacts in Germany and Donna Porter and Donald Shockey had provided many scanned records from a church in Germany. He is in the process of getting the German translated.

In 1998, 1999 the purchase of the land in Shockeysville was in progress. The plan was to dedicate the land at the 1999 reunion.

Les was in the process of getting some of the genealogy information on the web for the first time. He indicated that he and Bud had about 18000 names in the database.

Kenneth Shockey from Pennsylvania is in the process of scanning the red books and converting to text.

In 1999 and early 2000 Les became aware that some of the information he had on the web had been copied and the person copied the information as their own. This is still a problem today if we post family information. We are still trying to find a way to allow the family to view any of the genealogy information in the database.

At the 2000 reunion the plan was to bury a time capsule near the foundation of aunt Maggie's house. Aunt Maggie was the last Shockey to live in Shockeysville. She was very involved in the acquisition of the bell for the church, hence the ringing of Maggie's bell at the start of the general meeting at the reunions. The capsule did not get buried at the reunion, but Marie, Scott, David and Ken Shockey returned later in the year and buried the capsule. The plan was to unearth the capsule in 50 years. To see the placement of the time capsule see the 2001 newsletter.

John C. Shockey resigned as president of the fellowship at the 2000 reunion. He will still be on the board and help with the reunions. David Shockey was selected as the new president. John had served as the chairman or president since 1985.

At the 2001 reunion Ken Shockey had completed scanning the red books and I began proofreading and organizing the text to be able read on the computer.

At the 2003 reunion in Salt Lake City the author of the RootsMagic software and his wife came to the reunion and gave a presentation and answered questions about the program. He was also the author of Family Origins. The Family Origins software was being eliminated by Family Treemaker which had purchased the company that produced it. The information provided made the conversion to the new software much easier.

John C. Shockey passed away in September 2006. He would be missed by the leadership of the fellowship for his experience and guidance.

Les Shockey was in contact with multiple genealogists in Germany and Switzerland and determined that John Christopher Shockey's ancestors came from Switzerland. He also began leading DNA testing for members of the family.

In 2008 Les began helping Marie with the newsletter.

In 2010 Les and his brother found the location of John Christopher's cabin. More research of land records needs to be done to be certain that the location is really the correct location.

The newsletter for 2013 was the first to be placed on the internet. Marie's computer crashed and she ended up with a newer version of windows that did not support the old mailing list software.

On Monday of the 2012 reunion Bud had a heart attack and ended up having surgery to repair damage. David F. Shockey came from Kentucky and retrieved Bud's computer and other articles and took them to Marie's. Les and his brother came and got Bud when he was released from the hospital and his truck and took Bud to Les and Naomi's until he was able to travel. His son flew from Idaho to drive Bud home.

I first met Kaylene Sylvester and Charlotte Shockey at the 2013 reunion. Their contributions to the fellowship continue to grow.

There were several things that happened in the 2015 – 2016 time frame. David F. Shockey resigned as president and Les Shockey was nominated to succeed him. Another was the passing of Naomi (Les wife) who was always a center of happiness for those around her.

Charlotte began working with Les and Bud on the web portion of the fellowship as well as the database. Also thanks to Stacie George Briggs, Charlotte Shockey, Michelle Shockey, and Stefanie L. Steffey for their wonderful volunteer work on the Shockey FindAGrave Project headed by Charlotte and Stefanie.

Starting in 2017, Les began publishing the newsletter, since Marie was having trouble with her email and she also had some health issues.

Marie and Dan Shockey both passed in 2019. She and Ralph were the one who started what has become the Shockey Family Fellowship. Dan was one of the early leaders assisting Ralph and Marie.

The 2020 reunion had to be handled using zoom due to COVID. Jeffery Niles had joined in the DNA research.

Les Shockey passed away in 2022. Charlotte was able to complete the newsletter for the year. Les leaves a big hole to be filled for the fellowship. Charlotte is doing a lot and Keith Shockey (Les son) is now leading the Monday tour when the reunion is in Winchester. William Shockey (Ralph and Marie's grandson) is now the president.

The database continues to grow and the web site has continued to increase in members. Jeff Niles is continuing with DNA testing information. He and Charlotte are starting to publish a DNA newsletter. He and Charlotte have corrected the database to show the corrections based on DNA testing.

Charlotte and others created the Shockey Genealogy Committee to correct or corroborate previous information on the early generations. Jeffery Niles has been working on sorting out the different John's, Abraham's, Christopher's, and Christian's from as early as records show to 1850.

I attended reunions starting in 1978 and skipping to 1996 and then for several years. I am pleased to have met many new cousins over the years. I am proud to have met Ralph and Marie and visited with Marie for a number of years. Les, Bud and I became friends quickly, due to our love of messing with computers.

With Marie's blessing I began proofreading the scanned pages of the red books. As I worked I began building a set of files in HTML (the computer language used to build web pages) that can be read using a browser. I used the index pages from the books so that a quick search for a person could be reached directly. We are attempting to find a way to make these available in form similar to a book with copyright.

Most of the information in this history is taken from the newsletters on the web.

Thanks to Ralph and Marie for awaking the desire for what preceded us in our genealogy and history.



WILLIAM JOSEPH MOORE

William Joseph Moore (Bill), 93, of Indianapolis passed away peacefully Tuesday, October 29, 2024, after several months of declining health. Bill was born in Philadelphia on October 17, 1931, amid the Depression, to the late Robert Boyd and Margaret Kershaw Moore. He grew up in the Philadelphia suburb of Bala Cynwyd, spending summers at Ranger Lodge in Casco, Maine, or sometimes at the Jersey shore. He never forgot his Philadelphia roots, often teasing us with his Philly pronunciations and his devotion to Phillies baseball.

Bill finished high school in Indianapolis at Shortridge, class of 1950, and in1955 he graduated from Butler University with a Bachelor's Degree in marketing and finance. After college, Bill served in the Air Force,



specializing in bombardment and reconnaissance and eventually spending 3 years at McConnell Air Force Base in Kansas, teaching atomic weaponry technology and delivery techniques to SAC Air Force crew officers, a job which required high-level security clearance and which prevented him from leaving the country for 5 years afterward. While in the military, Bill also served as a JAG officer defending enlisted men who wandered into trouble off base. He was always proud that he never lost a JAG case. Though the Air Force tried to entice Bill to stay in the Service, he left active duty in 1960 with the rank of Captain.

Returning to Indianapolis, Bill began a career in real estate development and brokerage, first with Leo Lippmann & Associates, where he learned the development, design, marketing, and management of office buildings, apartments, and shopping centers, and later with the FC Tucker Realty Company (now Cushman & Wakefield), specializing in Office Leasing and Development. He handled some of the earliest large building projects in downtown Indianapolis, including the Indiana National Bank Tower, the Market Square Center, Merchants Plaza, and numerous others. Bill was the first

Indianapolis leasing agent to list over a million square feet of office space, holding at least one listing (the Gold Building) for an amazing 32 years! In the mid 70's Bill was part of a joint venture that was to develop Merchants Plaza (now PNC Center). As a principal and managing partner of that project, he oversaw the development of the project and brought in Hyatt (Hyatt Regency) for a mixed-use concept, creating the largest downtown project up to that time in Indianapolis...a million square feet, in itself. His ownership interests expanded in the 1980s to include shopping centers in Indianapolis and condos in Naples, Florida. He continued to lease and promote downtown real estate until his retirement at age 84.

Bill was introduced to real estate in his late teens, doing GI Bill appraisals for his father, and he was a fixture on the commercial real estate scene in Indianapolis for nearly 60 years. He was known to many as the Godfather of Downtown Leasing. Before he retired, he was told that he had leased more office space than anyone, ever, in Indianapolis. That record has most likely fallen, but Bill did it the old way...without computers. Many a deal was made on a napkin and sealed with a smile and a handshake.

Throughout his career, Bill was a strong supporter of downtown commercial real estate associations and activities. Always positive and encouraging, he was a true people person and genuinely cared about helping other professionals in the field. He was a tireless and generous mentor to young brokers, many of whom credit Bill for their current success.

Bill had a way with people. He could make people feel comfortable. He was at home talking with the highest person in the room and the lowest. He moved between people and ranks seamlessly. It was a talent. He always said what he thought, but he said it with humor. Everyone loved to be with Bill. He had an enormous number of business friends and acquaintances.

Over time, Bill received countless plaques, awards, and certificates of appreciation for his professionalism and achievements within his company and within the Indianapolis community at large. He was involved in numerous civic groups and activities. He was a founding member and served on the initial Board of Directors of the Indiana Sports Corp; was a founding member and on the initial Board of Directors of the Indiana Convention and Visitors Association, where he chaired several committees; was on the initial Board of Directors of the Commission for Downtown; was a member of the forward-looking City Committee; was Chairman of the second citywide CircleFest, 1982; was Publicity Chairman for the National Sports Festival,1982. These public/private committees were instrumental in forging a national identity for Indianapolis as an Amateur Sports Capital and as the professional sports town it is today. Bill's unwavering devotion to Indianapolis' downtown development saw him recognized as an important catalyst to the initial resurgence of downtown. On his retirement, he was heralded by his colleagues as an Icon of Indianapolis.

Family members have commented about Bill, saying that "there was a lot of kid in him." He never lost his youthful enthusiasm for life and adventure. If someone had a kooky plan or a crazy scheme, Bill was the first one on board. He loved teasing and being teased. He could focus his intense blue eyes on you like a laser or set them a-twinkle with mischief and anticipation. People gravitated toward Bill. He was a charmer.

He loved to sail and body surf at the beach, but also loved to travel to exotic places. He loved dogs and birds and pea soup and steak & kidney pie. He loved lilacs and baseball and Waterford and chocolate ice cream. He loved to joke. He loved being Irish. He loved being Bill.

We will miss you, Bill. Life won't seem quite as much fun without you. Goodbye.
